• YOU ARE HEREBY SUMMONED to appear in the District Court of Boundary County, at the Courthouse or other location as directed, in Bonners Ferry, Idaho between the dates of May 1, 2024 - September 30, 2024, on those dates as directed and determined by your Juror Number, to act as a trial juror.

 YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that if you are determined to be a qualified juror, you are REQUIRED TO follow the Instructions for Qualified Jurors below.

Instructions for Prospective Jurors

- **Boundary County Resident:** You have been randomly selected as a *prospective* juror to serve in the District Court of the First Judicial District of Idaho, in and for Boundary County, Idaho.
- Summons for Jury Duty: Applies to you *IF* you are a *qualified juror*, as determined by your responses on the Juror Qualification Form (enclosed)
- <u>Juror Qualification Form</u>: Complete and return the enclosed *Juror Qualification Form* within 10 days of when it was mailed, as required by state law.
- <u>Medical Release from Jury Duty</u>: Mark "yes" for box # 6 of the Juror Qualification Form. Have your medical provider (MD, DO, PA or NP) complete the *Doctor's Certificate for Release from Jury Duty* on the back of this Summons for Jury Duty, and return to the Jury Commissioner. The Medical Release from Jury Duty may be returned separately from the Juror Qualification Form.
- <u>Notification of Juror Status</u>: A postcard will be mailed to you on or before the date the Jury Panel begins. The postcard will state if you are QUALIFIED, DISQUALIFIED, OR POSTPONED.
- If you have any questions about your juror status, or scheduling, contact the Jury Commissioner right away, especially if you DO NOT receive a post card regarding your juror status. It is YOUR responsibility to follow up on your juror status.

Instructions for Qualified Jurors

- <u>Jury Duty Schedule</u>: Call the Jury Information Line *at least* once per weekend, and/or check the Jury Website for updates. **It is your responsibility to follow the schedule.** Separate written notice is *not* normally sent to jurors for specific trial dates. Selection of qualified jurors for a trial date starts at the lowest available juror number, moves up the list, and usually circles back to the beginning. You may be assigned to 2-3 trials during your period of jury service depending upon the trial schedule. Keep checking!
- Call/check the working night before the trial date to which you are assigned, unless the trial was previously cancelled. Trials can be cancelled, and/or dates/report times changed, up to the working night before the trial date.
- <u>Temporary Excuse from Jury Duty</u>: Notify the Jury Commissioner in writing of any unavailable dates as soon as possible via Email, FAX, or letter. In case of emergency, a phone call is sufficient until written notification is possible.
- <u>Jury Duty Payment</u>: \$5.00 per half day, \$10.00 per full day, and \$.655 per mile from your residence to court and back. You will not receive any compensation if you appear for a trial that has been cancelled or moved as noticed on the Jury Information Line or Website. You will be paid for appearing *on time* at the assigned trial(s) *after* your 4-month term of jury service is complete.
